treatment (n)	<i>something that is done to cure an illness or injury, or to make somebody look and feel good</i>	
drugstore (n)	<i>a shop/store that sells medicines and also other types of goods, for example cosmetics</i>	
(to) dispense (v)	<i>to prepare medicine and give it to people, as a job</i>	
counter (n)	<i>a long flat surface over which goods are sold or business is done in a shop/store, bank, etc</i>	
compound (n)	<i>a thing consisting of two or more separate things combined together</i>	
compounding pharmacy	<i>the process of mixing drugs by a pharmacist to fit the unique needs of a patient</i>	
prepackaged (adj)	<i>put into packages before being sent to shops/stores to be sold</i>	
(to) interact (v)	<i>if one thing interacts with another, or if two things interact, the two things have an effect on each other</i>	
manufacturer (n)	<i>a company that produces goods in large quantities</i>	
hangover (n)	<i>the headache and sick feeling that you have the day after drinking too much alcohol</i>	
drowsy (adj)	<i>tired and almost asleep = sleepy</i>	
aptitude (n)	<i>natural ability or skill at doing something</i>	
aptitude test	<i>an occupation-oriented test for evaluating intelligence, achievement, and interest.</i>	
license (n)	<i>an official document that shows that permission has been given to do, own or use something</i>	
administration (n)	<i>the people who plan, organize and run a business, institution, etc</i>	
paperwork (n)	<i>the written work that is part of a job, such as filling in forms or writing letters and reports</i>	
to develop (v)	<i>to think of or produce a new idea, product, etc. and make it successful</i>	
research (n)	<i>a careful study of a subject, especially in order to discover new facts or information about it</i>	
researcher (n)	<i>the person who does research</i>
